Dear Volunteer,

At long last, we have said goodbye to winter and full lockdown, and are now welcoming spring with open arms. I hope the changes in regulations, paired with the lovely weather have enabled you to catch up with your friends and family outdoors - who you may not have seen for some time. But please can we kindly remind you to remember to stick to the government guidance too.

We know that many of you have had your volunteering put on hold and are now eager to restart. However, we ask for your patience for a little longer, as we are working in the background on recovery plans to be able to bring volunteers back when it is safe to do so. Your Volunteer Officer/Supervisor will be in touch with you once we know more.

On a similar note, we do appreciate that for some of you, your circumstances may have changed. If that is the case and you can no longer commit to volunteering, please could you either let us or the service you support know as soon as possible, so that we can archive your volunteer record. This will also help us with our recovery plan and enable us to start recruiting again when the time is right.

For those who have volunteered throughout the pandemic, we would like to say a massive thank you. Doing everything virtually has been strange for us all, and like many, we welcome the day when we can return to the office and see people face-to-face. Your support has been invaluable over this time, and we will never be able to thank you enough for all you have done.

WHAT ELSE HAS HAPPENED AT LVP SINCE LOCKDOWN?

When the pandemic hit, our Community Support Befriending service was put on hold and we developed a new Telephone Befriending role.

We communicated what was required and we were soon delighted with how many people signed up. Since the start of lockdown last year, our volunteers have supported over 1,400 people, which is truly amazing! Many of those supported were really struggling, and receiving a regular telephone call made a real difference to their lives.

We are still recruiting for Telephone Befrienders, so if you know someone who may be interested in this role please refer them to the 'Opportunities section' of our website at https://lancsvp.org.uk/opportunities/.

Back in November 2020, we were tasked by the NHS to support their Covid-19 mass and local vaccination programme across Lancashire and South Cumbria. We were overwhelmed by the number of people willing to help and are aware that many of you have supported this initiative. So far, we have processed 1,787 volunteer applications and supported over 30 local/mass vaccination centres across Lancashire and South Cumbria.

LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL SERVICES

UPDATE ON LIBRARIES, MUSEUMS & ARCHIVES

As we follow the roadmap out of lockdown, Lancashire Libraries, Museums and Archives will start reopen to the public, and that means a gradual return of volunteer roles. We know that some of our volunteers are eager to get back to their roles, while others are much more cautious. Everyone is different and we want you to know that all your volunteering matters to us, and we want you to return when you feel ready.

Lancashire Libraries

Lancashire Libraries increased their opening hours for browsing, borrowing and computer use from the 12th April. At LVP we are working with the Library Service on the best way for all the 'inlibrary' volunteering roles to restart and we'll let you know the plans as they are agreed. We don't expect 'in library' volunteering to restart until after 21st June 2021 at the very earliest.

Museums

Museums are planning to open for indoor visits from the 17th May and volunteers are returning to their museum roles to support this. At LVP we are looking to recruit some additional volunteers at Lancaster Judges' Lodgings Museum and <u>Burnley's Queen</u> <u>Street Mill</u> to support the re-opening. Home Library Service volunteers

Our Culture Hack volunteers have connected with and contributed to several digital, online volunteering activities throughout the pandemic. Home Library Service volunteers began to support book deliveries from September 2020 and this continues with libraries using a mix of volunteers and LCC delivery drivers to get books out to their customers.

The Lancashire Archives

The Lancashire Archives Service opened, in a Covid-safe way, for prebooked visitors from 13th April. Some volunteers have returned already with restricted numbers and on a rota basis.

ADULT DISABILITY DAY CENTRES

Leyland Day Centre reopened its doors on Monday 24th August 2020, and the staff were delighted to welcome back up to twelve service users each day. Everyone was very happy to be back at the centre with their friends (there were a lot of smiling faces!), as many of them had not stepped outside their homes since March last year.

"In terms of our volunteers, we miss them very much, and they make a huge contribution to our service. One of our volunteers, Roy, helps in our garden. As he is outside and has no service user contact, he has been able to continue volunteering at the day centre, once restrictions eased last year. He has done a terrific job and it was great to see the gardens looking great when we returned."

Since March 2020, our Independent Custody Visitors (ICVs) have been unable to do physical visits to Lancashire Custody Suites, however, they were still monitoring through telephone reporting.

We're now delighted to confirm that they have returned to visits and the feedback from the ICVs themselves and the Custody Management Inspectors have been extremely positive. ICVs are the eyes and ears of the residents of Lancashire, and it is terrific that they have now returned and are able to undertake their role fully.
