# DO YOU KNOW WHAT'S HAPPENING IN YOUR AREA?



When it comes to crime prevention and safety, why rely on second hand information?

Stay In The Know and find out what's really happening in your area by receiving regular updates, learn about what your local neighbourhood policing team is doing to keep your area safe and receive updates from partner organisations, such as Lancashire Fire and Rescue.

You can choose who you receive alerts from. You can choose to receive email, voicemail or text messages.

Members registered to receive only text messages will still receive important information, but not all messages/warnings circulated on the system will be circulated via text message.

Registration is quick, simple and completely free. You can register <u>here</u>.

Your personal details will be securely held under the provisions of the Data Protection Act 2018 and will never be shared with commercial organisations.

Through Lancashire Talking you can let the police know what it's like to live in your area and gives you the chance to tell them what issues matter most to you.

It is also an opportunity for you to raise any concerns you may have.

Significantly, your feedback received via Lancashire Talking enables our Neighbourhood Policing Teams, together with partner agencies, to act on the information received and tackle the issues raised.

In doing so, you are given a voice in how we prioritise our Neighbourhood Policing activity.

Members of our community messaging system *In The Know* will then receive updates from their Neighbourhood Policing Team about the action taken based on the feedback we receive.

### Knife Angel coming to Lancashire

The Knife Angel, a huge statue made from 100,000 seized knives, will be on display in Lancashire throughout November 2021.

The sculpture, created by the British Ironworks Centre to highlight the negative effects of violent behaviour.

It will be hosted outside Blackburn Cathedral with a schedule of activity to combat knife crime set to take place between the 4th and 29th of November.

A civic opening ceremony, a serious violence conference and a pupils conference will form part of the activities planned for the Knife Angel's month long visit residents and professionals from across Lancashire will have the opportunity to get involved.

### HOMEGROWN, HOMESPUN

A ground-breaking regenerative fashion project

Homegrown Homespun is a ground-breaking regenerative fashion project in collaboration with designer Patrick Grant, his social enterprise <u>Community Clothing</u> and <u>North West</u> <u>England Fibreshed</u>.

They have turned unused land in the town into a field of flax and woad. From the flax we'll spin and weave linen, and from the woad we'll make natural indigo dye.

They will use this to make denim and some great sustainable clothing as well as making new habitats for wildlife and improving our outdoor spaces.

They're looking for volunteers to help us with the whole process from sowing the seeds during the spring to harvesting our flax and woad in the autumn. Homegrown/Homespun jeans in designer and manufacturer Patrick Grant's Community Clothing collection, is on display in the town centre during the British Textile Biennial this Autumn (1-31 October 2021).

Carers Link Lancashire supports those who are caring for a friend or family member (in Hyndburn) with a long term illness or disability on behalf of Lancashire County Council in accordance with their rights as outlined in The Care Act 2014.

Their youngest registered carer is 6 and the oldest is 104!!

They are a FREE and CONFIDENTIAL service and we can

- Offer you a Carers Assessment designed to assess how the caring role affects your health and wellbeing
- Help you plan for an emergency and provide care for your loved one in the event of a blue light emergency
- Request Respite or adaptations to the home
- Support with Benefit Claims and form filling
- Support with Grant Applications for a Short Break or White Goods for the home
- Provide fun activities for you to take a break
- Provide Courses for you to take part in
- Peer Support and Friendship Groups
- Provide FREE PPE (During Covid)
- Young Carers Support/Activities
- Sign posting & referring to relevant support services
- Volunteer Opportunities
