### Health & Safety

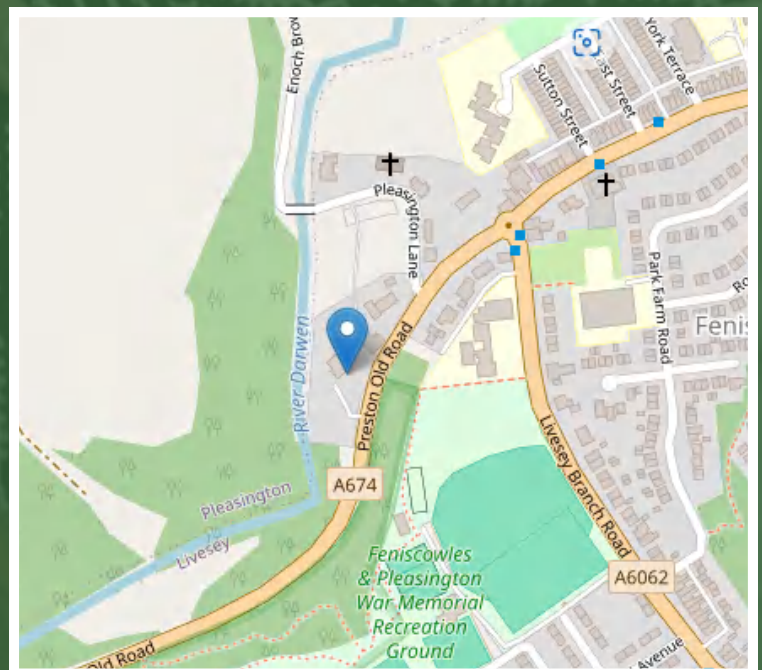

The Deaf Village is our aspiration for a working outdoor village within and around the White House grounds; a beautiful space in the Fennisowles-Pleasington Valley cusp that brings hearing and Deaf communities together in nature.

Our vision for the North West region is to establish a strong, cohesive and prosperous community where everyone is active, treated fairly and thriving, and where people's faiths and cultures are understood and respected. Our activities will address segregation, reduce social exclusion and continually value and embrace our diversity, enriching all of our lives through community endeavours.

For individuals requiring additional long-term support for everyday life, we can also tailor an individual social care package where vital, yet missing, Life Skills are developed directly to enable the individual to function, then thrive, across all spheres of life.







# The White House

The White House offers a safe and secure, stable, communal living environment for Deaf residents with complex needs not otherwise catered for across the usual strands of care provision. Here, young adults can work towards their own future aspirations, discovering themselves along the way.

Safe, secure home life is often only a privilege afforded to those individuals without sensory/complex needs.

Our residents typically come from backgrounds where they have struggled within their own family home environment or have been caught up in social care for most of their young adult lives. The White House looks to reinstate a sense of safety and dependability promoting an accessible family life, that encourages dreams, aspirations and opportunities.

**The White House fosters a family ethos where we all come together to learn from each other and support each other, whichever life path we may be on.**
